Anthony hospital by the Olerich-Twit ambulance and died about three hours later. The attending physician said that death was due to head and chest injuries.

Mr. Grabner was attempting to make a left turn south off the Breda road when he apparently lost control of the car and clashed into a ditch, Sheriff Al Thorup said.

The fatality was the fifth on county highways this year, as compared to one at the same time a year ago. Ten persons, an all-time high, lost their lives in highway mishaps in the county in 1954.

He had been in poor health the past few

years with stomach trouble, but not until last week did he complain of feeling worse than usual. Friday morning he was on our streets and consulted a physician while here, but nothing serious was thought of it. Early Saturday morning he became worse and a physician was summoned and all that medical aid could do was done, and returning a few minutes later the physician found that be had been taken with an attack of heart trouble and passed quietly away to the Great Beyond, where pain ant suffering are unknown.

Mr. Koster was born December 22, 1864, at Berge, Province of Hanover, Germany, and was therefore 55 years, 4 months and 22 days old at the time of his death. Deceased was bereft of his mother at the tender age of three years, and at the age of 11 years, in company with his brother William, emigrated to this country to take up their abode with their father at Mionk, Illinois, who had emigrated here a few years before. He put in four years of study at St. Francis College, of Quincy, Illinois, and four years at Mt. Calvary, Wisconsin.

In 1874 he came to Carroll County, and at the age of 21 he commenced to teach, teaching different schools all over Carroll County. He also taught school in Sioux County. His father died when deceased was 26 years old.

In 1898 he gave up the profession of teaching and has since been making his home with his brother, and devoting some time to his farm in Sioux county. About two weeks ago he returned from his farm, where he went with the intention of putting up a fence on his farm, but his renter was too busy just then, and Mr. Koster remarked at the time, "Maybe I won't have time later on." Little did he dream that his time on this earth was so close to an end.

Up to two years ago the deceased had been spending the winter months in California and New Mexico. Deceased was highly educated and leaves to mourn his untimely death, two brothers, William of this place, and Herman of Bartelso, Ills.

Funeral services were held Monday morning from St. Bernard's church at 9 o'clock and interment made in the Catholic cemetery.
